REPEAT INFORMATION - CONGRESS H.R. 299 BILL BLUE WATER NAVY VIETNAM VETERANS OF 2019

The US Senate has unanimously passed the Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans Act & signed by the President.

Complete eligible ship's listing & dates, are at **www.benefits.va.gov** for the Navy & Coast guard Ships Associated with Service in Vietnam & Exposure to Herbicide Agents dated March 1, 2019.

Use Everett F. Larson DD830 dates of Operation:

- Ship Category 1 - Ships operating primarily or exclusively on Vietnam inland waterways. **Operated on Mekong River during December 15, 1967.**

- Ship Category 4 - Ships operating on Vietnam's close coastal waters for extended periods with evidence that crew members were ashore. Operated. LARSON crew members went ashore while anchored in Van Phong Bay on September 15, 1969.

NEW MILITARY COMMISSARY ACCESS FOR VETERANS AND CAREGIVERS

The DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS and the **DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE** allow newly eligible customers on Military Bases to shop effective January 1, 2020.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE? WHEN AND WHERE CAN I SHOP?

Commissaries, exchanges and some morale, welfare and recreation facilities will be open to Purple Heart recipients, former prisoners of war, veterans with any service-connected disability and caregivers registered with the Veteran Affairs Comprehensive Assistance for Family Caregivers Program beginning January 1, 2020. Reserve members who fit this description will also have access.

Retired service members, Medal of Honor recipients and veterans with a service-related disability rating of 100 percent will continue to have access to on-base facilities and obtain a DOD identification card to get on base.

AS AN ELIGIBLE VETERAN, HOW WILL I SHOP?

The DOD and **VA** have approved two (2) ways for newly eligible veterans to get on-bases to use their benefits in person: the Veteran Health Identification Card (VHIC) or a letter from the VA along with an acceptable REAL ID-complaint identification, which includes passports and some state driver's license.

The VHIC must show the Veteran's eligibility: Purple Heart, Former POW or Service Connected - on the front, under the Photo, to be accepted. More information about VHIC's and be found on the VA website.

Access to bases will not be granted to new customers who qualify for VA health care, but are not enrolled in it and thus do not have a VHIC, according to the latest Military OneSource news release.

"If they choose not to apply for enrollment to obtain a VHIC, they will not have access," adding that only the VA can verify the eligibility of Veterans and Caregivers.

WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE A VHIC?

The "Small group" of Veterans who do not qualify for VHIC due to a non-compensable service-connected condition rated at 0% will need a REAL-ID complaint identification and their Health Eligibility Center Form H623A, which shows they are in Priority Group 8E. This is "temporary" until the DOD and VA can come up with a long-term alternative for these veterans.

Veterans who can't locate their HEC H623A letter can call the VA at 1-877-222-VETS (8387).

Beginning January 1, 2020, these newly eligible Veterans will have to pass an initial basic, on-the-spot background check to gain access and then an automated check each subsequent time. Veterans or Caregivers with felony convictions, felony arrest warrants of derogatory information related to criminal history or terrorism will be prohibited from entering. Depending on the type of installation, these VHIC carrying Veterans will be able to enroll in recurring access, which lets them bypass the visitor control center and enter though the gates. A spouse or anyone accompanying them might also be able to enroll in this recurring access if the guest has an identification that supports it, according to the recent Military OneSource news release.

The Veteran's VHIC or letter will be used at the point of sale. The cashier will either scan the card or manually input a code when the VA HEC Form H623A is used.

Currently, all honorably discharged Veterans can shop over the internet though the Veterans Online Shopping Benefit. They can set up an account for any of the military exchange websites: Army and Air Force Exchange System, Coast Guard Exchange, Navy Exchange Command and the Veterans Canteen Service.

CAN I BRING A GUEST WITH ME TO GO SHOPPING?

Yes, but the guest cannot buy anything and they must be with the sponsor at all times.

All military installation may not always comply with this guest shopping. Check ahead of time.

WHAT IS THE PROCESS FOR A CAREGIVER?

The process is similar to that of VHIC-holding Veterans, but Caregivers will receive a letter issued by the VA Office of Community Care saying they qualify as a primary family Caregiver of an eligible Veteran.

To be admitted on base and to purchase items form. The commissary or Exchange, they will need to bring their Va letter plus one of the types of identification listed below: DOD common access card, REAL IDcomplaint driver's license or other ID issued by a state, territory, possession or District of Columbia, US Passport bearing an unexpired immigrant or nonimmigrant visa or entry stamp, Federal personal identify verification card, VHIC or Transportation Worker Identification Card.

When shopping on base, Caregivers will use this letter at the point of sale; since it can't be scanned like the VHIC, the cashier will manually put it into the register.

WHAT TYPE OF MWR FACILITIES WILL I BE ELIGIBLE FOR?

Newly eligible Veterans and Caregivers will be able to shop at Commissaries one Exchanges and use some MWR facilities: golf courses, bowling alleys, movie theaters, marinas & kennels. The DOD official temporary duty and permanent change of station lodging facilities will be on a space available basis.

WAIT, THERE ARE FEES?

Credit Card fee is 1.9% & Debit Card Fee is .5%. **Reference:** <u>military.Com</u>, **Dorothy Mills-Gregg**
